Jason Carroll Holloway is a writer and researcher based in Kansas City and the founder of Seventh City Press, the independent imprint behind his Masters X Trilogy. His work refuses the usual border between imaginative and intellectual writing: novels built on real archaeoacoustics research, medieval manuscript scholarship, and the documented subterranean geography of his own city. The trilogy — *The Inheritance of Frequency*, *The Grimoire*, and *The Kingdom* — braids the undeciphered Voynich Manuscript, the medieval Ars Notoria, and a recurring 111.2 Hz frequency into a conspiracy that begins beneath Kansas City and reaches a crypt sealed under Prague since 1267. Much of the science underpinning the fiction is published openly through the Analysis Chamber, a research archive on his website. Holloway holds an M.A. in English Literature from Mercy University in Dobbs Ferry, New York, along with degrees and certificates in psychology, sociology, creative writing, and data analytics. He has also written scholarly criticism, including a monograph on the novelist John Hawkes. He lives and writes in Kansas City.
